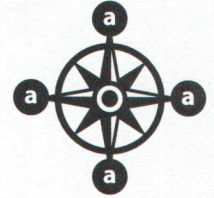


2003 World Cruise


