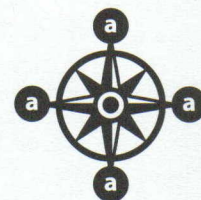


# 2003 World Cruise


