Check in at the front desk, and be guided to the Museum's 85 seat "Wild West Theater" for a 15 minute documentary featuring highlights from the historic silent film "The Round Up," with silent film star Fatty Arbuckle, and classics like "Gunga Din," "How the West was Won" and "Brigham Young". The documentary continues with hundreds of clips from films made right here in Lone Pine's iconic Alabama Hills and ending appropriately with the Statler Brothers singing their musical tribute, "Whatever Happened to Randolph Scott?"



Now you're ready to meander through the extensive collection of movie memorabilia showcased in thematically arranged exhibits. John, Hopalong Cassidy and Roy Rogers will seem like your personal tour guides to the array of photos, costumes, props, scripts and priceless movie posters.

Discover the WORM from "Tremors" as you near the entrance to the secret cave where Tony Stark was held captive in "Iron Man". Take a photo opportunity in front of the full size Stagecoach used in "Rawhide" or with Gene Autry or Humphrey Bogart classic movie cars. Imagine a horseback ride through the Alabama Hills on a fabulous silver saddle from the extensive collection of Jim Rogers.
