Black wooden fences line the fronts of the samurai residences. Kakunodate, a smaller version of Kyoto in northeastern Japan, was a castle town that flourished as the seat of the Akita feudal clan. Walking on this street gives visitors the feeling of a being back in the Edo period.

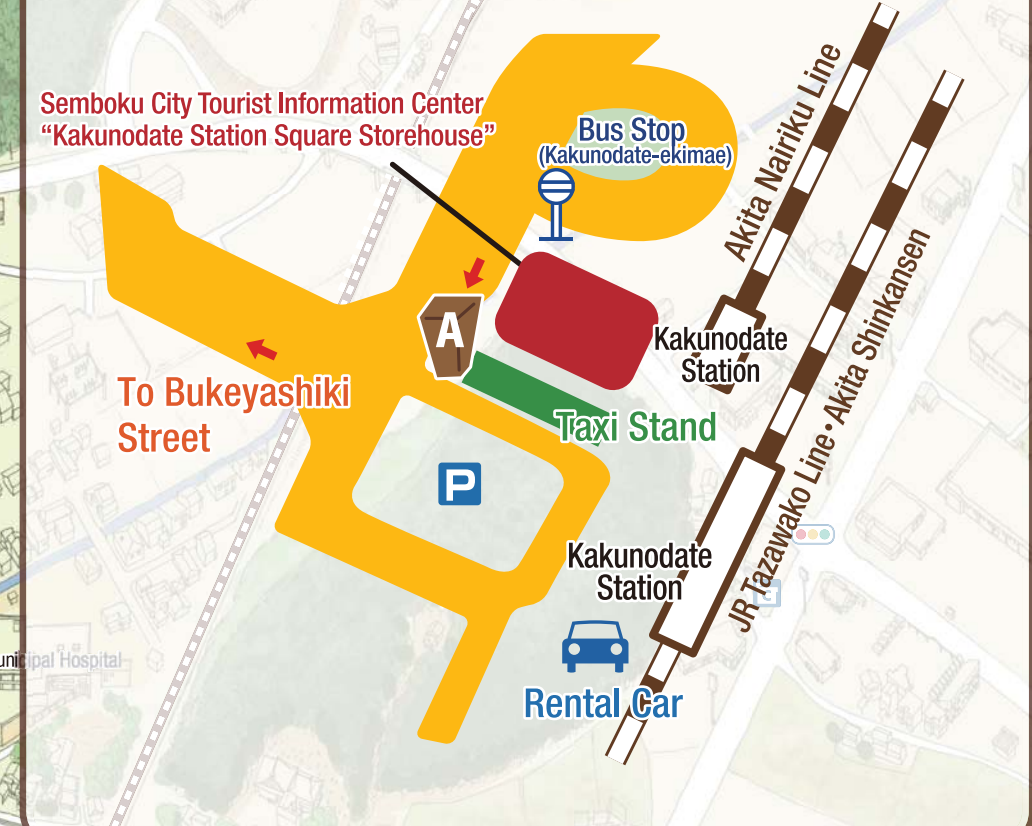

1 Ishiguro House
[Semboku City Designated Cultural Asset]
Among the samurai residences in Kakunodate existing today, this one is the most prestigious residence of the highest pedigree.

2 Matsumoto House
[Akita Prefecture Designated Tangible Cultural Property]
This is where the movie "Twilight Seibei" was filmed. A cozy house surrounded by a brushwood fence.

3 Kawarada House
[Semboku City Designated Cultural Asset]
This residence features the authentic Bukeyashiki (samurai house) building style of the Edo period, remaining unchanged to this day.

4 Odano House
[Semboku City Designated Cultural Asset]
The house of an intermediate samurai of the branch family of Naotake Odano, the founder of Akita Ranga (Dutch-style painting) and the illustrator for "Kaitai-Shinsho", Japan's first anatomy book.

5 Iwahashi House
[Akita Prefecture Designated Cultural Asset]
This is where the movie "Twilight Seibei" was filmed. This simple house with Kobabuki shingled roof was the residence of an intermediate samurai.

6 Aoyagi House
[Akita Prefecture Designated Cultural Asset (main building, gate, storehouse)]

The Festival of Kakunodate
September 7 – 9 [Nationally Designated Important Intangible Folk-Cultural Asset]
18 parade-floats parade through town while performing Oyama-bayashi music and the Te-odori (a hand-dance). When 2 floats face each other, a "negotiation" starts for passing rights, and when negotiations break down, "Yama-Buttsuke" begins, and the floats ram into each other until one is able to pass by. A Nationally Designated Important Intangible Folk-Cultural Heritage.

February 13
(At the city-operated Sakuranamiki Parking lot)
February 14
(30 and more places in Kakunodate)
An enchanting festival of brilliant fire rings dancing in the snow. The hallmark of this festival is the sacred fire that drives out bad luck from the rice fields, while people pray for the health of their family and safety throughout the year.

7 Nishinomiya House
A popular tourist attraction consisting of the main building and five Kura-storehouses. In Kura, handicrafts are exhibited and sold. You can also enjoy a meal or a coffee/tea.

8 Hirafuku Memorial Museum of Art
This museum features a collection of the works of Suian Hirafuku, a master of modern Japanese painting, and his son Hyakusui Hirafuku, as well as many local painters under the same discipline. Also, the museum serves as a place to introduce the works of present/young artists.

9 Kakunodate Kaba Craft Densho-kan
The Kaba craft is a traditional Kakunodate handicraft using the bark of mountain cherry tree. Here, you can see the technique of the craftsmen up close as well as the craft, culture and historical documents on exhibit.

10 Shinchosha Memorial Museum of Literature
The documents on the works of people who were connected with Giyo Sato (the founder of the publishing company, Shinchosha) are on display here.

11 Ando House
Established in the 6th year of the Kaei period (in 1853). A manufacturer of miso, shoyu and pickles. The kura-zashiki, a storehouse parlor built in the Meiji period, was designed for protection from fire. Open to the public.

12 Tatetsuya・Tomachi Museum
Built in the 33rd year of the Meiji period (in 1900), the quiet majesty of the Japanese garden and the quaint rooms carry the atmosphere of this merchant house through to the present day. Visitors can also view articles of hobbies and housewares which their ancestors used since the late Edo period on exhibit here.

13 Tenneiji Temple
Founded in the first year of the Kansei period (in 1624). The family temple of the Ashina Clan was relocated from Aizu. The main gate of a Buddhist temple is the remains of Kakunodate Castle, and the Fudezuka, or ink-brush mound, of Hyakusui Hirafuku is in the mountain in the back of the temple overlooking the town.

14 Jokoin Temple
Founded in the first year of the Kansei period (in 1460). This is the family temple of the Northern Satake Clan. The temple grounds house the graveyard of the reinforcement groups of clansmen from Kyushu, including the Omura Clan, which were lost in the Boshin War of the late Edo period.

15 Jojuin Temple Yakushi-do
The local shrine worshipping Yakushi, the Buddha of healing. Called "Yakushi of the peak", it is used by many people as a place of prayer. The festival of Kakunodate is a traditional event associated with Jojuin Temple / Yakushi-do

16 Kakunodate Shinmeisha Shrine
The town shrine worshipping the Kakunodate Amaterasu Sun Goddess. This shrine features Ema, the votive picture of Naotake Odano is dedicated, as well as a monument of the place of Masumi Sugae's death.

Rice cakes made with ground, stone-milled glutinous rice and bean jam inside.

Morokoshi
A confectionary made with azuki-bean powder put inside wooden frames to harden and then baked.

<Kakunodate Satake-Kita Family Tradition>
A dish of meat and seasonal vegetables cooked with Sansho-miso (miso paste with Japanese pepper). The fragrant Sansho-miso enhances the abundant flavors of the ingredients, creating a dynamic yet delicate taste. This is a local cuisine rich in romantic history. While you eat, you might like to imagine the scenes of the Satake-Kita family going hunting.
