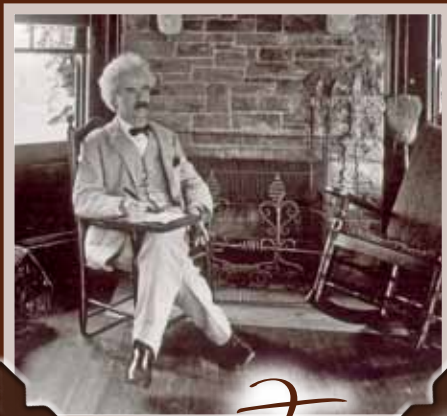

Located one mile south of Hannibal

Mark Twain wrote, "By and by somebody shouted, "Who's ready for the cave? Everybody was. Bundles of candles were procured and straight away there was a general scamper up the hill." An experienced guide will escort you on a one-hour tour featuring points of interest mentioned in Mark Twain's writings. Walkways are level and smooth and there are no steps. Persons of any age can easily make the tour. Bring a light wrap as the cave is 52 degrees year around. Wear sensible walking shoes and be sure to bring your camera.
